GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: MARK 9:30-37

- Are you greater than Jesus? If not, then why should we think that whatever we say the other should understand and follow that?! Even Jesus was not a successful teacher. He is trying to teach His own disciples, but they don't understand it, and even are afraid to clarify their doubts. As Jesus was teaching them, they were distracted and were doing some other business. But Jesus is not angry with their lack of grasping. Jesus leaves a space for being not understood or even misunderstood. So don't be adamant that you should be understood always. Always grant the freedom to others.
- Be a child and receive the childlike. There is a child in every adult. Do you want to be received by Jesus? Then revive the child in you. 'Child' is a potentiality of us.
- For a child, everything is wonder. Its basic characteristic feeling is 'awe.' Observe nature and everything with the eyes of a child. It is only through wonder that we can experience the glory and greatness of God. Romans 1:20 says, "Ever since the creation of the world, His eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things He has made."
- A child may not be able to speak, may not have language and vocabulary. The only language of a child is its cry. And the mother will understand its need! So your cries will be understood by Jesus.
- A child does not understand the realities and dangers of this world. But it trusts its mother. That trust is absolute. So do, the disciples trust Jesus. Be a child and trust your Lord absolutely.
- Receiving a child, Jesus tells you to receive the childlike. Don't cheat those who trust you. By our words or deeds, we are not supposed to humiliate others. What is your attitude toward others? Do we

make others feel less than they are by the way I relate to them?

■ Revive the child in you and be a child of the Lord.
