

From the Gospel according to LUKE 23: 35-43

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ,

King of the Universe.

No matter what is happening around us, we have a King and His name is Jesus.

There is a story of a homeless beggar by the side of the street. One day he saw the royal caravan approaching - the King himself. The beggar thought, "Today I will receive something big!" But to his shock, when the king reached him, the king extended his hand and said "My son, will you give me something today?" The beggar was confused. Reluctantly, he gave one small grain of rice. The king smiled, blessed him and moved on.

That night, as the beggar emptied his sack, he found a single grain of rice -but made of pure gold! He wept and said: "If only I had given my whole bag...."

Dear brothers and sisters, Christ the King is the King who comes asking -not to take from us, but to 'transform' what we give Him. Whatever we give him; our sins, our weaknesses, our priorities, anxieties..... Whatever we give to our King Jesus, He would transform them into gold and precious!

Jesus is a King of paradox! His crown - thorns. His throne - the cross. His scepter - nails. His robe - scarlet of mockery. His army - broken people redeemed. His kingdom - your heart.

Dear friends, next week we will be entering Advent. At this juncture the Church reminds us: the King who came in humility will come again in glory.

As we approach the Altar today our King and Lord Jesus once again stretches out His hands asking: "My child, will you give me something today?" Give Him your fear. Give Him your sin. Give Him your worries. Give Him your heart. And He will transform your life into gold the gold of his Kingdom. Because Christ is King- yesterday, today, and forever. Amen
