GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: MARK 7:31-37

Healing the Deaf and Mute

- There is a man who is deaf and mute. He might not have known Jesus as he cannot hear or speak. So he was taken to Jesus by the 'community.' Individualistic approach to God is not the perfect Christian way. The disabled and the crippled (the suffering ones) are brought to Christ by we, the community.
- Having brought him to Jesus, that community is praying for him. They are interceding for the suffering one. The needy one is silent though, Jesus is listening to the prayer of the faithful. We should be praying for others.
- Christian means "one who is in community." No One-Man-Show is encouraged by Jesus. Be in relatedness and be concerned about the need of the other person.
- In the crowd, that man was not able to experience God. So Jesus took him off by Himself away from the crowd. Luke 19:4 speaks of the dwarf Zacchaeus that "so he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to see Jesus." So you may not be able to have God experience being in the crowd. You have to step forward; may have to run ahead. Yes, you have to take a step further in your prayer/spiritual life if you want to have God experience.
- Jesus touched that man on ears and tongue. When you are desperate, feel loneliness, rejectedness...it's then Jesus takes you to Himself. Compassionately He touches you and He expresses His love and mercy for you. So in your struggles and troubles, don't be disheartened, for Jesus is waiting for you.
- "He has done everything well," is the certification of the crowd for Jesus. This same Jesus is alive in each and every one of us. Is the Jesus operative in us? What do others say about us? Every moment of life we have to think, "if it were Jesus in my place, what/how He would have acted?" Be another Jesus. Especially being

compassionate to other people. Then you also will have the same certification!

■ This "Ephphatha" prayer is there in our Catholic baptism. We receive Holy Communion; and so we are duty-bound to untie the tongues of others. We are to listen to others. You should forgive the other so that he/she may feel the freedom. We have to give the other freedom in life; we have to be with them compassionately.

MEMORANDUM

FROM: Bishop Steven J. Raica + Syn

RE: Directive regarding COVID / Delta Variant

DATE: August 27, 2021

Concerns are being raised regarding the recent uptick in COVID / Delta variant cases throughout the State of Alabama. In fact, most, if not all, ICU beds are at or near capacity in this most recent surge, more than the previous surge, mostly by the non-vaccinated. Health officials are bringing an urgent appeal to take this matter seriously.

In the State of Alabama, vaccinations have sadly lagged well-behind the national average. I echo and agree the words of Pope Francis who explains that a vaccination is an act of "charity toward neighbor". It is an important step to retard the spread of this pernicious virus. The competent authorities have urged all who can to be vaccinated. This week the Pfizer vaccine was approved by the FDA. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith has also vouched for the morality of taking the appropriate vaccination. Thus, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccine may be received without moral reservation. For those eligible, taking the vaccination helps everyone.

For those who have chosen not to be vaccinated for personal reasons of conscience concerns, should continue with prophylactic measures to protect themselves, their families, colleagues, and those in their social circles. These measures include, but are not limited to, masking appropriately, maintaining a social distance, quarantining when there's an exposure, and frequent COVID tests.

The Diocese is not disposed to granting "religious exemptions." Those who express concerns for conscience reasons should do so on their own initiative after consultation with their primary care physician.

While I am aware that we have not had a viral outbreak in our offices (Thanks be to God!), I nevertheless express my concern for the well-being of our diocesan chancery community as the variant is spiking. I ask that we observe the following protocols beginning Monday, August 30, 2021 until the end of September unless there is an update in the meantime.

1) **Wearing masks** while inside our Chancery building, in the corridors and in meetings insofar as possible.

Masks can be optional in meetings if all parties are vaccinated;

- 2) **Social distancing** insofar as possible;
- 3) **Quarantine / work from home** if you have been exposed.

Those who have not been vaccinated are urged to do so at their earliest convenience, even if they must leave work to do so. If for some reason you cannot be vaccinated, then you should be tested on a regular basis as determined by your physician.

It appears the Delta Variant will peak soon. Let's all play our part to reduce the burden of this infection on our families, our co-workers, our communities. Above all, may we be especially mindful of the doctors and nurses who risk their lives every day providing dedicated, specialized care for those affected.
