GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: JOHN 14:23-29 SERATHE IN PEACE; BREATHE OUT LOVE SERATHE OUT LOVE

■ Do you really love Jesus? If yes, what is the evidence? In John 14:23, Jesus says the evidence for the fact that you do love me is your obedience. It is a general fact we will obey out of fear of punishment and out of love. But Jesus makes it clear that the love of God is intrinsically related with obedience to the Word of God.

■ What is the Word of God, that you should obey? It is not only the Bible, but the whole person and life of Jesus Christ. If you do love Jesus, then you should follow the models of His life. You should be following His footsteps at every moment of life.

■ If you prove that you do love Jesus by obeying Him, then God will dwell with you. Your intimate companion will be God Himself. If God is with you always, then the rest follows automatically. You will be free of fear, you can experience peace and courage!

■ Ask yourself: do you really experience that peace and courage given by God? If you still experience fear, anxiety, etc. it all proves that you don't really love Jesus. Now it is important to seek, how can we experience this gift of peace in our daily lives?

■ Do you have a burdened heart? What is it that burdens you? Could it be your own sins? If so, come back to the loving God. Be repentant and sorry for your sins. Go to the confessional. Open up your heart to the Lord. Let your sins be taken by God. He is a merciful and ever-loving God, waiting for you in the confessional. Thereby you will experience the peace of God.

■ If your heart is burdened by someone else's actions then you may be feeling hurt, insecurity, fear, grudge, revenge...these all can keep peace away from your heart. The solution is to surrender yourself to God. Give Him complete control over your life. At the moments of 'offertory' in our Holy Mass, you have to offer all these hurts/wounds and feeling into the chalice. Our Eucharistic Lord will accept your offerings, and as the wine turns out to be the Precious Blood of Christ, you will be freed from all your burdens. Then you can experience peace, in every Mass, and throughout your life. The Peace of God be with you. Amen.
