GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: JOHN 6:1-15

❖ FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI ❖

■ *The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1324-1327)* states that, "The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life! All other sacraments and ecclesiastical ministries and apostolates are oriented to Eucharist. For in the Blessed Eucharist is contained the "whole spiritual good of the Church," namely Christ Himself. Eucharist is the "Sum and Summary" of our faith."

■ Saint John Paul II had declared a "Year of the Eucharist" and it was from October 2004 to October 2005. On that occasion, Pope exhorted the world to always keep in mind and pray, "Stay with us, Lord, for it is almost evening" (Luke 24:29). Jesus agreed to this prayer. He stays with us always in the "breaking of the bread." It was this Lord who 'explained' the Scriptures to them and 'opened their eyes' to recognize Him. So children, up to the last moment of your life, don't ever forget to pray "Stay with us Lord, for it is almost evening."

■ We know that even Judas received communion from the Lord Himself. Jesus didn't deny it! But we know what happened next. Thus Judas received the very first sacrilegious communion, according to Saint Paul, which makes the receiver "guilty of the blood." In the Old Testament, 'blood guilt' is murder. So sacrilegious communion renders one guilty of murder.

■ Blessed Alexandrina da Costa lived for the last 13 years of her life only with Holy Eucharist. She died on October 13, 1955. Another servant of God, Flores de Jesús, better known as Lola, was born in Brazil in 1913 and died in 1999 at the age of 86. This servant of God, Lola, lived her last 60 years on the Eucharist alone. Martha Robin from France, who died at the age of 79 in 1981, lived only on the Holy Eucharist for the last 50

years of her life. So we all can live on the Holy Eucharist alone because it is love and life-giving love.

■ Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta, India is a real miracle of the Holy Eucharist. She said, "If we have our Lord in the midst of us, with daily Mass and Holy Communion, I fear nothing for my sisters nor for myself. Jesus will take care of us. But without Him I cannot be; I am helpless." So dear friends, without worthy reception of the Holy Eucharist, you cannot be a child of God. So whenever possible, you should come for Mass and receive communion.

■ In today's Gospel we see Jesus feeding more than five thousand people with five loaves and two fishes. The real hero in this miracle is the boy who gave those five loaves of bread and two fishes to the Lord. If at all this boy didn't give it to the Lord, this miracle would not have taken place. If you expect any miracle from the Lord, then you should be ready to offer Him something. Without your offerings God cannot help you.

Sirach 35:6 reads, "Do not appear before the Lord empty-handed."

Verse 35:10, "Be generous when you worship the Lord."

Verse 35:12, "Give to the Most High as He has given to you."

And verse 35:13, "For the Lord is the one who repays and He will repay you sevenfold."

In Malachi 3:10, "Test me in this, says the Lord Almighty, and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it."

So the Eucharist is a miracle God gives you depending upon your offerings to Him. Amen.

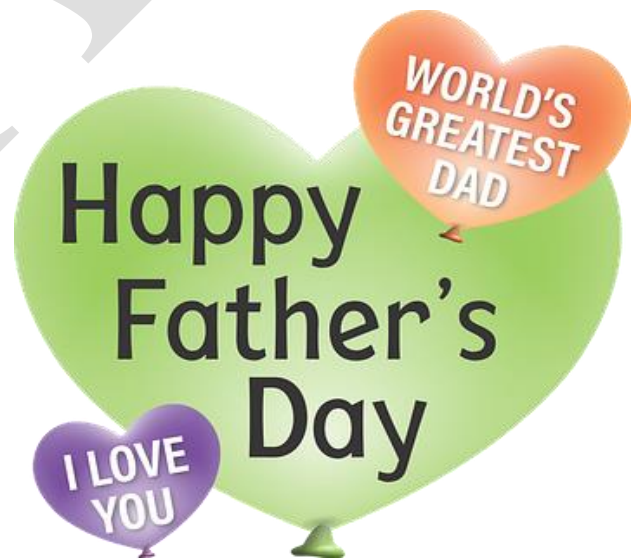
WORLDWIDE MARRIAGE ENCOUNTER
