SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

John 1: 29-34

Your Mission: Reveal the Christ in the Other.

In today's Gospel we see the testimony of John the Baptist about Jesus, the Son of God. Today, I would like to invite your attention to two main characters: John the Baptist and Jesus the Christ.

The role John played in his life, was that of a baptizer. John's duty was to baptize with water. The ultimate orientation or goal of this role in his life, as a baptizer, was to reveal the Christ, the Son of God, in the person of Jesus of Nazareth. In John's own words: "I came baptizing with water that he might be made known to Israel." At the moment of baptism, John the Baptist is revealing to the world that Jesus of Nazareth is the Son of God.

We all play different roles in our lives. We may be playing the roles of housewives, mother, sister, daughter, caregiver, maybe husband, head of the family, brother, child, manager etc. There is God, Christ, hidden in every human person. Whatever roles may we be playing in our lives, the ultimate purpose of all those roles is to bring out the Christ 'hidden' in the other.

How can we reveal the Christ in the other? How can we help the other to bring the Christ outside from within him? And keep in mind that is our goal of everyday lives and duties. John could reveal the Christ in the person of Jesus because of his own attitude. John speaks about Jesus: "A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me." John's attitude to Jesus is that Jesus is always greater than John himself. It is the virtue of humility that helps John to bring the Son of God in the person of Jesus of Nazareth to daylight.

John is teaching every one of us a great lesson today. Our duty of life is to reveal the Christ in the other. In order to achieve this goal, we must humble ourselves and consider the other as greater than me.

John's testimony about Jesus is: "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." 1Jn 3:4 "Sin is the transgression of the law." Jesus came to take away this sin. What is this sin of the world? There is a rhythm in the universe; a rhythm of interrelatedness of every creature and everything in the universe. Not only the human beings are in interrelationships; but also, everything that is in the universe is related. Whenever this rhythm of relationship is broken then it becomes sin. Jesus' role therefore is to reconcile the broken relationships in the universe.

Just like Jesus we are all baptized Christians. Through baptism it became our duty too, to help reconciling all the broken relationships in the world. How can we maintain the rhythm of the universe? How can we reconcile the broken relations in the world? John testifies about Jesus that: "I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him." Yes, we have to be spirit-filled people to maintain the rhythm of the universe, and to reconcile the broken relations in and around us.

Following John's model, we must consider everyone else as greater than us and help them to bring out the Divine element that is hidden within them. Following Jesus' model, through baptism, we are duty bound to maintain the rhythm of interrelatedness in the universe and help others to reconcile the broken relationships.

God may guide us all in our lives, Amen.
