**THE ASCENCION OF THE LORD**

**Mt 28:16-20. WALK WITH THE LORD**

Jesus came down from heaven to share in our human life, in all our trials, sufferings and joys. Today He ascends into heaven so that we can follow him. "For the Son of God became man so that we might become God." St Athanasius. Therefore the Ascension of the Lord guarantees our own Ascension to heaven.

Mt 28:17 "When they saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted." These disciples represent me. I experience the miraculous presence and protection of my Lord in different ways and at different moments of my life. Though I experience Him, almost all the time I doubt Him. Whenever I pray, I am not that sure, whether my Lord will answer me!

Doubt is a weakness, a drawback. But the response of the Lord to that doubting disciples is awesome. He empowers them with the Holy Spirit. He recruits the doubting disciples as His ambassadors, witnesses. Though I doubt my Lord, He trusts me! He is such a wonderful God.

Mt 28:20 "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." This is the most empowering verse in the Bible. My Lord will be with me, who is weak and tempted always, at all the moments of my life. He is my Power.

Ascension guarantees heaven to me under one condition. We have to observe whatever the Lord has commanded us. Rom 13:8 "The one who loves another has fulfilled the law." So just by loving other human person we become heirs of heaven.

We may doubt our Lord, but, He has made us His witnesses. We have to proclaim our faith. Proclamation or witnessing is made through life. One has to proclaim the good news to oneself. We should have a transformed life, which loves other human person unconditionally. Then through our life we should be models to the others.

Always follow the footsteps of the Lord. He has gone ahead of us. Following Him we can reach heaven. God May guide us all. Amen.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Catholic Church globally, including the Diocese of Birmingham locally, has consistently urged all nations to protect the lives and dignities of all migrants as well as to work towards establishing orderly and just immigration systems. We know that here in our own diocese, the effects of migrants from various nations having to flee because of dire poverty and/or astonishing degrees of violence have directly impacted many of our own communities.

A central challenge of our modern-day immigration system is that there are simply too few legal and orderly paths for migrants to come to the United States. At the same time, as people on the move for various reasons, each is imbued with human dignity. All must find our homeland a place of welcome and opportunity as many of our ancestors did. I ask you to continue your prayers for progress in this regard so that hearts might be changed, and policies enacted which justly respond to the abiding hopes and aspirations of vulnerable populations while national sovereignty and domestic security are ensured.

As we anticipate the World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees later this year, I invite the priests, deacons, religious and lay faithful to gather with me and people of good will for a Mass for Migrants and Refugees on **Friday, June 2 at 7pm at the Cathedral of Saint Paul** in downtown Birmingham. All are warmly invited to attend, and priests are most welcome to concelebrate the Mass as we pray in a particular way for this intention.

The Diocese of Birmingham is both blessed and honored by the presence of so many migrants and refugees from around the world. It is my hope that many from these various communities will be represented among other members of the faithful at this special Mass as we pray that our desire to be a unified Body of Christ may soon be realized.
