GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: LUKE 6:27-38 ♦ THE GOLDEN RULE ♦

- Luke 6:31 reads, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." This is known as The Golden Rule. This is a general principle, but it's all inclusive. All the laws and regulations could very well be summarized within a single Golden Rule principle.
- In verse 36, "be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." We can understand two main truths of life here. In general we think 'mercy' is a gratuitous gift of God, something granted by God. But I came across a different meaning of mercy as "mercy is defined as NOT granting what one deserves!" In Romans 3:10, "There is no one just, not one." And 3:23, "all have sinned." So all humans, without exception, are sinners. In Romans 6:23, "the wages of sin is death." So what we deserve from God is death, wage of sin. But God NOT leaving us to eternal death/hell is called His Mercy. God instead grants us eternal life (Romans 6:23). When we beg for God's mercy, we are actually begging God NOT to punish us.
- In Luke 6:36, "Be merciful just as your Father is merciful." Whereas Matthew tells the same passage in Matthew 5:48, "Be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect." Thus we can rightly conclude that the perfection of God consists in His Mercy (not punishing the sinner, not granting the sinner what he deserves, i.e., Death).
- Jesus is inviting us to perfection. It also means that nobody is perfect yet! Yes, it is a great revelation. Just think of our relationships. We are ready to love the perfect ones. But, in fact, if your partner is perfect, then anybody/everybody will love him/her. You are not a must. You have to be merciful as your Father is. You have to forgive others unconditionally. You should not let the other (may he/she be at fault) be punished. The quality of your mercy depends upon your ability to forgive and accept the other as is.
- The purpose of 'mercy' is to lead the sinner to repentance. God is not punishing you, thereby you may be repentant and change your ways. All the virtues Jesus wants us to practice are aimed at the conversion/repentance of the offender. In other words, we baptized Christians are committed to be merciful; committed to lead others to repentance. Our forgiving mentality can win souls for the Lord. May our merciful God bless you. Amen.
