From the Gospel according to LUKE 21:5-19

Not a hair on your head will be destroyed....

In the first reading, prophet Malachi is speaking about God's punishment on evildoers. They would be burned in fire. And the punishment would be total and complete. But the Lord gives hope to the believer and says that He would safeguard them; He would heal them. Perseverance in faith is the key. It is said: "Persevere! You will win. Not immediately, but definitely." A.A. Milne said, "Rivers know this: There is no hurry. We shall get there someday."

When the Nazis invaded Poland in 1939, they immediately attempted to suppress the Catholic Church. Over the course of the next several years they killed a third of the Polish clergy and outlawed Faith Education. One Polish layman, Jan Tyranowski, decided to do something about it. He began a secret group, called the Living Rosary, to instruct people in their faith. This group had to go through a lot of struggles and obstacles. However over the course of time, 10 of the young men who attended these groups became priests! One of those priests is known to history as Pope Saint John Paul II. In all our struggles and trials we have to persevere with patience and prayer. A saint is a sinner who keeps on trying and that trying can change the world.

In today's Gospel we have Jesus' prophecy of the destruction of Jerusalem Temple. But He encourages the listeners to persevere; because, God would protect them. Jesus predicts that all sorts of persecutions may fall on the believers, but He gives the Hope by assuring "not a hair on your head will be destroyed"- by your perseverance you will secure your lives!

Dr Norman Vincent Peale shares his experience of overcoming a hurricane while on a cruise in the Atlantic. His captain was so experienced that he managed to sail around the danger. Later on, the captain shared his philosophy as: 'if the sea is a smooth, it will get rough and if it is rough, it will get smooth. But with a good ship you can always ride it

out.' Our ship is our faith in Christ. With faith and perseverance we can always ride any struggles and trials out. God is with us. King Duncan says: "Perseverance is the key to success. Never give up and keep making efforts. It is often the last key in the bunch that opens the lock."

Let us be Confident in our Lord, Trust Him. Not a hair from our head would be lost without Him knowing about it!

God may keep us all safe, Amen
