The DIVINE MERCY IMAGE

The Divine Mercy image is a depiction of Jesus based on a vision that Saint Faustina had in 1931. According to the vision the image of Jesus was to be drawn as raising his right hand in blessing and pointing with his left hand on his chest from which pour forth two rays; one red and one white (translucent). The rays streaming out have symbolic meaning: Red for the blood of Jesus which is the life of souls and Pale for the water which justifies souls. The whole image is symbolic of Charity, Forgiveness and Love of God referred to as the fountain of Mercy. The image was to have a depiction "Jesus, I trust in you!" on it.

"My daughter, tell the whole world about my inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of my tender Mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of my Mercy" (Diary, No.699)

"I want the Image to be solemnly blessed on the First Sunday after Easter; and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it." (Diary No. 341) "The first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy... By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (Diary No 742) Among other things, it offers a Plenary Indulgence.


"I am giving you three ways of performing Mercy to your neighbors: the first -by DEED, the second -by WORD, the third -by PRAYER; these three levels cover the full scope of Mercy, and it is an unshakable evidence that a soul loves Me. By this a soul glorifies and pays reverence to my Mercy" (Diary, No. 742)

About the Divine Mercy, Pope St John Paul II said that it's "the Easter gift that the church receives from the Risen Christ and offers to humanity." It is a gift that God has given out of love for all of us.

WHY 3:00 P.M.?

"I remind you, My daughter, that as often as you hear the clock strike the third hour, immerse yourself completely in My mercy, adoring and glorifying it; invoke it's omnipotence for the whole world, and particularly for poor sinners; for at that moment Mercy was opened wide for every soul. In this hour you can obtain everything for yourself and for others for the asking; it was the hour of Grace for the whole world - Mercy triumphed over justice". (Diary 1320)
