Memorare to Saint Joseph

O God, who by Thy ineffable Providence did vouchsafe to choose Blessed Joseph for the spouse of Thy most holy mother, grant we beseech Thee, that he whom we venerate as our protector on earth may be our intercessor in Heaven. Amen

GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: MARK 10:2-12

- The very first verse (10:2) says that the Pharisees wanted to 'test' Jesus and the question here and now is about divorce. Why this particular question now? Verse 10:1 says the location is "into the borders of Judea beyond the Jordan" and that is Perea, the territory of Herod Antipas. Antipas had divorced his wife, Aretus, to marry his brother's wife, Herodias. John the Baptist criticized this and he was beheaded! So now the Pharisees expect the same fate for Jesus.
- Mark uses the Greek word (Peirazontes) for 'testing.' This is the same word used to speak about Satan tempting Jesus in the wilderness. In the Old Testament we see God testing the faith of people/individuals. But there is a difference in word used and in its meaning also. God tests the people hoping that they will pass the test while Satan and the Pharisees test Jesus hoping that He will fail the test.
- With regard to the question of divorce, Jesus asks them about the law of Moses. Referring to Deuteronomy 24:1-4, Jesus says that this relaxation of law is given by Moses because of their hardness of heart. From there Jesus takes them to the Book of Genesis. In this discourse we can see a movement—from Moses to God; from Deuteronomy to Genesis; and from what is permitted to what is intended.
- Genesis 1:27 says, "So God created humankind in His image, in the image of God He created them, male and female, He created them." Yes, God created humankind. Here 'human' means a perfect combination of male and female. So in every marriage a 'new human' is born. From then on, whenever either of the couple thinks/speaks selfishly as in words 'my or mine, you, yours, etc.'...then that 'human' starts to die. If the human nature in us is dead, then we may become animals. So in marriage, selfishness kills the human nature of partner and makes him/her an animal! So it is the duty and responsibility of a Catholic partner to

keep the other partner human and alive. Should never let the partner become an animal.

- The Greek word Jesus used to denote "what God has joined together" is "synezeuxen." It means joined together or closely yoked together. Hereby Jesus uses the image of 'yoke' as a metaphor for marriage. Couples are like two oxen yoked together. Yoked oxen can accomplish tasks that would be too much for a single animal. So marriage is an interplay of mutual respect and interdependence. It is a loving and faithful union of man and woman. In order to work it out, couples have to 'be merciful just as our heavenly Father is merciful' (Luke 6:36) and 'be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect' (Matthew 5:48).
- In the Catholic Church, there is NO DIVORCE. The Church may declare a marriage as Null and Void. Divorce is a declaration ending a 'valid' marriage. Whereas Nullity is a declaration that a valid marriage 'never existed.' The marriage was invalid from the beginning.
